

MY SCHOOL DC LOTTERY



The My School DC lottery gives families the opportunity to apply for available seats in early childhood programs for 3- and 4-year-olds, out-of-boundary DCPS schools in grades K-12, citywide schools, DCPS application high schools, and participating charter schools. A single, random lottery is run by My School DC to determine placement of new students at all participating schools. The Office of the State Superintendent of Education oversees the My School DC lottery in collaboration with DCPS, the Public Charter School Board, and participating charter schools.

KEY WORDS



Destination school (also feeder pattern school): A middle, high, or education campus school that a student has a right to attend based on the student completing the terminal grade at an elementary or middle school during the previous school year.



In-boundary school (also neighborhood school or zoned school): A school that a student has the right to attend based on a student's home address. To identify your student's in-boundary school, visit **enrolldcps.dc.gov/node/41**



Out-of-boundary school: A school other than a student's in-boundary or feeder pattern school.



My School DC application: An online application families must use to apply for DCPS out-of-boundary schools (K-12), all DCPS preschool (PK3) and prekindergarten (PK4) programs, citywide schools, DCPS application high schools (9-12), and participating public charter schools.



My School DC common lottery: A single, random lottery that determines placement for students at all participating My School DC lottery schools.



Application high school and program: A DCPS high school or program that requires an application for entry into the school. There are two types of DCPS application high schools and programs.

Citywide: A school that does not have a designated boundary and therefore cannot be claimed as an in-boundary/zoned school. Citywide schools can only be accessed through the lottery and do not provide guaranteed enrollment to any student/family. Ron Brown is the only DCPS citywide application high school.

Selective: A DCPS high school or program that admits students based on specific eligibility criteria and requires application for entry into the school. All students eligible to enroll in grades 9-12 can apply, but only those who meet a selective high school's or program's requirements will be eligible to attend.





Why Bard High School Early College DC?

Bard High School Early College DC (Bard DC) operates through a partnership between Bard College and DCPS. Students have the unique opportunity to earn 60 transferable college credits and an Associate in Arts degree from Bard College alongside a high school diploma, free of charge. Students in grades 9-12 are taught by college faculty in seminar classes, where they develop foundational knowledge across the liberal arts and sciences as well as skills of writing, critical thinking, and communication. Students matriculate into the Associate's degree program after the 10th grade. Bard DC prepares students to enroll in four-year colleges and universities, often with advanced standing. Bard DC is part of a national network of Bard Early Colleges serving over 2,850 students in five states.



What great courses can I take?

The majority of faculty at Bard DC have a terminal degree (e.g. PhD, MFA) in their field of study and college teaching experience, and college electives will vary depending on faculty expertise. The requirements for the Associate's degree include the Seminar Sequence (four-semester Great Books course) and courses in science, mathematics, literature, history/social science, foreign language, and the arts. Why Columbia Heights Education Campus?

CHEC is a unique globally-themed 6-12 dual language campus that blends rigorous instruction with personalized education, driven by technology, bilingualism and social justice. All students in 9th and 10th grade have their own laptops. On April 17, 2016, CHEC was once again named by The Washington Post Challenge Index as one of the top high schools for students in the Washington area. CHEC is also a Restorative Justice and Empowerment of Young Men of Color school. All students interested in grades 9-12 must apply through the My School DC lottery to be considered for admission.

In 2019, CHEC was one of the 65 schools in the District that got a 3+ Stars rating. Our AP Participation rate was 98.56%. Our graduation rate was 16% above the city average and our daily attendance rate was 27% above the DC average.

Career Technical Education (CTE) Programs & Career Academies: DCPS operates 50+ CTE programs within 20 different Career Education Pathways across 17 DCPS high schools. CTE Programs are rigorous and engaging, they prepare students for several postsecondary opportunities, and include: sequential career-themed courses, work-based learning opportunities, the opportunity to earn early college credits and industry-recognized certifications. In our efforts to enhance and support our CTE programming, DCPS currently operates 21 NAF Career Academies at 11 high schools throughout the city (10 of these Academies started this school year). Each academy is centered on one of several career themes: Engineering, Hospitality, Health Sciences, Transportation, Mass Media or Information Technology (IT), that are align closely with high-wage, high skill, and high-demand jobs in the District. Embedded within the Career Academy model is a strong student and teacher support structure, college and industry partnerships, career-focused internships, and rigorous curricula that culminate in industry recognized certifications. All Career Academies are supported by industry advisory boards (IABs), whose members include leaders from the fields of business and higher education.


